

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS:

English 1, 2, 3, 4 (1 Credit, 4 required)

Emphasizes grammar skills, beginning with sentence patterns, and going on to the eight parts of speech, phrases, and clauses. Each course expands on the skills and parts of speech.

Math (1 credit, 4 required)

Math 1/Algebra I: Introduces basic algebraic skills in logical order, including relations, functions, graphing, systems of equations, radicals, factoring, rational equations, probability and statistics, and quadratic functions.

Math 2/Geometry: Enhance your student's problem-solving abilities through the study of Geometry. Each lesson reinforces geometry concepts and helps develop critical thinking skills.

Math 3/Algebra 2: Focuses on developing reasoning skills through the discussions of advanced algebra concepts such as quadratic equations, polynomials, complex numbers, logarithms, and trigonometry.

Math 4/Consumer Math: Helps students develop the knowledge and skills they need to successfully handle their personal finances. Topics include developing a budget, filing taxes, and planning a vacation.

Foreign Language (1 credit, 2 required)

Latin 1: An introduction to Latin that takes a logical, systematic approach to grammar and syntax. This facilitates retention and understanding to ensure skills mastery and rapid recognition.

Latin 2: Continues the journey of learning Latin grammar and encourages everyday translations.

P.E. (0.5 Credit)

Develops fundamental skills, team play, conditioning, strategy, and principals of personal health and fitness.

Health (0.5 Credit)

Teaches students the basic needs of the human body as well as emotional, spiritual, and physical. Builds an understanding of the different systems and their functions.

Sciences (1 Credit, 3 or 4 required)

Physical Science: Inspires students to view matter and energy as the building blocks of God's Creation.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS CONTINUED:

Biology: Your student will learn about cellular biology, genetics, taxonomy, microbiology, botany, zoology, and human anatomy.

Psychology: An introduction to the major areas of psychology, including history, theories, brain function, emotion and behavior, learning, memory, lifespan, intelligence and more.

Chemistry: teaches the basics of chemistry including molecular structures, bonding, balancing chemical equations, along with organic chemistry basics.

History (1 Credit, 3 or 4 required)

Geography: provides a survey of both geographic principles and every country of the world through regional approach.

World History: Students will analyze five key themes throughout history from a biblical approach.

U.S. History :teaches about the development of the United States as a nation.

Government: informs and empowers students to have a biblical view of government. It teaches students about our nation, its development, and its system of government.

Career Pathways & Electives

Bible: (1 Credit) An expanding course that teaches the basics of Christianity and applying it to personal growth, everyday knowledge and how to utilize these principles for a successful and Godly future.

Typing: (0.5 Credit) An engaging and interactive experience while you learn how to type.

Speech: (0.5 Credit) involves topic choice, research, organization, and effective communication. Projects include introductions, interviews, demonstration speeches, informative and persuasive speeches.

Literature: (0.5 Credit):Teaches the student literary analysis by discussing 6 literary elements through reading the following stories and novels: Red Badge of Courage, Hatchet, Of Mice & Men, Animal Farm, Lord of the Flies, To Kill a Mockingbird, Hamlet, and so many more!

Composition: (0.5 Credit): Introduces basic narrative techniques and their examples in scripture. Students will develop key writing disciplines by crafting a handful of original stories.
